

# HOW WILL PEOPLE TRAVEL TO THE FACILITY?

The new site is well located for future public transport, walking and cycling routes. This means visitors will have lots of choice about how to travel to the facility.



## Bus

People will be able to travel by bus to the facility. In mid 2018 when Auckland Transport's New Network bus schedule is implemented there will be three routes to the facility, the N65, N66 and N78. A pedestrian crossing will be located in front of the facility to allow people to cross Bush Road safely.



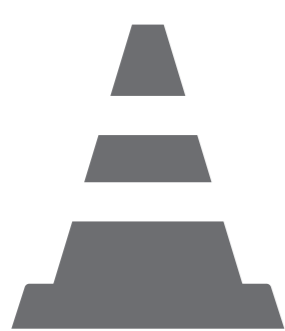
## Driving

For people driving to the facility there will be 370 carparks located at the north and south ends of the facility just off Bush Road. There are also 200 carparks available near the existing field that can be accessed from Jack Hinton Drive. There will be a bridge and path over Alexandra Stream to connect the existing sand turf and the new facility.



## Walking and cycling

People living nearby will be able to easily walk to the facility, especially once the bridge over Alexandra Stream has been built. There will also be a number bike parks located at the facility for people who wish to cycle.



## Traffic during major events

When the facility holds a major event attracting between 5,000 – 7,000 people, just like other major events across Auckland, North Harbour Hockey will create a Traffic Management Plan to manage the large number of people travelling to the facility. The Traffic Management Plan will set out how North Harbour Hockey will manage the traffic, this may include actions such as encouraging use of public transport and providing shuttle services.
