

# AT Conducts Initial Review Of Signalised Intersections On Constellation Drive Corridor





Following members complaints we asked AT to conduct a initial review of the signalised intersections on the Constellation Drive corridor, as there had been several complaints for drivers heading west on Constellation, drivers exiting Parkway Drive onto Constellation and also exiting Paul Matthews Road onto the motorway.

The two factors AT found were:

"a temporary speed limit reduction on SH18 between Paul Matthews and Albany Highway from 80 to 50kmh which has negatively affected the discharge rate onto SH18, and more traffic exiting the SH1 northbound off ramp at Constellation turning left towards Paul Matthews after the opening of the second left turn lane. Otherwise, there have been no recent changes to the operation of the traffic lights at these intersections.

We (AT) are seeing an increase in congestion, both in the Constellation Dr area and across Auckland

- Funding \$1600 worth of cover crop seeds for May planting (increasing soil health, plant survival, carbon sequestration and reduction of erosion)

- Funding 4 teaching sessions for school students to visit the site, learn about sustainability and urban regeneration (\$1000 per session/\$4000 for 4 education sessions in 2023)
- Funding the materials for 6 new bioreactors to harvest onsite mulch to turn into 4 tonnes of bioorganic compost to reinvest onsite (\$2500)
- Funding the 2023 seed collection and growth of new seedlings for planting in 2025 (\$700)
   Undertaking a 90 minute organisational working bee on site this May 2023.
