With consultation on Auckland Council's Annual Plan 2025 - 2026 (Annual Budget) open for

Council is still facing significant budgetary challenges, proposed solutions to which such as a 5.8% rates increase for the average household, will be included in the consultation process. Help Us To End Ongoing Rosedale Pollution - Site

Visits Available From 17th Over recent months Council has been made aware of a number pollution events in the Rosedale Industrial area. As most stormwater doesn't get treated, any contaminants that enter the stormwater drains can end up in our waterways. This doesn't mean that industrial sites are necessarily putting things into the stormwater on purpose but there may be poor practices which


are unintentionally contributing to the contamination of the waterways. Stormwater management is important on industrial sites due to the potential type, range and quantity of contaminants which could reach vulnerable environments. These contaminants can reduce the amount of available oxygen, change the nutrient levels, affect the temperature or pH or physically smother wildlife like Pukeko and eels. Due to this, we would like to visit businesses within the catchment, that can be identified as

practices on site are in line with best practice and to check whether the requirements of the Auckland Unitary Plan (Operative in Part) (AUP(OP)) are being met. You may have been visited by the Industrial Pollution Prevention Programme (IPPP) in the past, which is a local board funded initiative to educate businesses on best practice.

Timber - It's Not Photocopy Paper. Reducing And **Disposing Of Waste**



A tongue in cheek suggestion was made to me a while ago "builders treat timber like office workers treat photocopier paper". In 2019, quantitative research conducted for Auckland Council revealed a strong desire within the building sector to reduce timber waste. Given that timber typically makes up about a quarter of the waste by weight from a typical house build - even with the use of prenailed frames - this isn't surprising. There are several key areas where timber waste can be minimised. While no one wants to be the

waste. Keeping a close eye on timber orders helps foster a culture of making the most of every Proper storage and handling of timber are also crucial. Keeping timber packets dry and protected from the elements helps ensure they are fully utilised. A tarp or timber cover is usually sufficient to

Quantity Surveyor who underestimates timber needs, over-ordering is a significant contributor to

protect outdoor-stored timber. A surprising amount of timber is used for bracing frames, with suppliers often delivering a packet of timber along with the set of frames. Unfortunately, it's not uncommon for perfectly good bracing timber to be cut to the length of a skip and discarded. Formwork is also another application where


timber is often discarded after a single use. Fortunately, alternatives like reusable bracing are now available, significantly reducing the need for timber in this context. Additionally, reusable bracing has been reported to be easier to install and remove.

Timber pieces that are an arm's length or longer can be reused if they are kept out of skips and stored properly. These pieces can often be reused on the same site, a different site, or donated to local facilities or organisations. Even shorter pieces of timber, often considered waste, can be useful to many people.

More alternatives to skips are emerging for usable timber. Many communities have local recycling centres that will accept reusable lengths of timber for free. It's simply a matter of keeping this material out of your skip and dropping it off. BRANZ have recently provided an interactive map to help builders and tradespeople find locations to drop off reusable materials. You can find it here: BRANZ Interactive Map With a bit of forethought and planning, reducing timber waste can be an easy and effective way to

decrease site waste volume and cost, while elevating the value of this important resource.

From Passion To Legacy: Elliette Roslin's Journey In **Music Education**

For Eliette, being a part of Business North Harbour has been a rewarding experience. "It's such a fantastic community," she says, expressing her pride in the local network she's become an integral part of. From one small shop to a thriving Academy that impacts countless lives, Eliette's journey continues

to inspire many, proving that with vision, determination, and a deep passion for what you do, anything is possible.


